Water Institute Updates

Highlights of the 2016-2017 Water Institute Annual Report submitted to VP David Norton and SVP Jack Payne were presented and discussed. The full annual report can be accessed <u>here</u>.

The status of ongoing WI coordinated projects was discussed including:

- Completion of the \$3M SJRWMD CRISPS project. A video is currently being prepared summarizing project findings and a press release will be issued in early January
- Kick-off of the \$5M multi-institution USDA-NIFA FACETS (Floridan Aquifer Collaborative Engagement for Sustainability) Project. For more details see project website
- UF WI's new membership in the <u>USGS Southeast Climate Science Center</u> (<u>SECSC</u>). As UF's liaison Wendy Graham will participate in the ecohydrology working group and help craft the next USGS CSC RFP for research. Wendy will solicit input from WI faculty, especially FAC members, as this process unfolds. As a partner institution UF will be eligible to submit proposals to the call. Other partner institutions include Auburn University, Duke University, North Carolina State University, University of S. Carolina and University of Tennessee. Proposals will require partnership with USGS scientists. FAC member Todd Osborne indicated particular interest in following this opportunity,
- On-going coordination of the Florida Water and Climate Alliance and possible upcoming grant opportunities with the <u>NOAA Restore Act Science Program</u> which will have a water focus.
