# 1. Announcements

# 2. Old Business

• Agree on strategy and timeline for reviewing Program Initiation Fund Proposals

Each FAC member agreed to review 3 or 4 proposals. Assignments were circulated and conflicts of interest discussed. It was agreed that proposals would be scored out of 100 according to the PIF guidelines (posted on google group site). Scores will be provided to Wendy by Sunday Feb 25<sup>th</sup>. The FAC will meet to discuss proposals Monday Feb 26<sup>th</sup> from 3 to 5pm. At that time strengths and weaknesses of each proposal will be discussed and summarized. A copy of score and strengths and weaknesses will be provided to proposers.

• Establish time-line and strategy for engaging outside stakeholder groups

The Science Advisory Committee and the Program Development Council proposed at the last meeting were discussed. Pros and cons of having two different committees were presented. The following strategy was agreed upon for engaging outside stakeholder groups and developing the Water Institute Strategic Plan

- Wendy will summarize the current status of the strategic planning effort in a draft action/strategic plan. This will be circulated to FAC for review and comment before the next meeting.
- A Water Institute Distinguished Scholar Seminar Series will be established

We will invite a series of high profile scholars to campus. Visits will be composed of a general WI seminar (we will ask them to highlight important advances in Water Research/Policy/Management or the past decade.. or something similar); a meeting with the WI FAC (during which we will discuss the mission, status and action plan for the Water Institute, ask specific questions based on their backgrounds and experiences, and pick their brains for good ideas regarding strategic initiatives); and a meeting with interested WI faculty. Each FAC member will be asked to nominate and co-host one of these speakers over the next 12 months. Travel and a \$500 honorarium will be offer to each speaker.

• At the conclusion of the Distinguished Scholar Seminar series (May 2008) we will complete a Status report of the first 2 years of Water Institute

Activities, and 5 year Strategic Plan for the institute based on the input received during these visits and other activities. An external advisory board will then be formed to review the 2 year activities and the 5 year strategic plan. This should position us well for the UF internal 3-year review of the Water Institute.

# 3. New Business

#### Discuss membership and formation of Symposium Planning Committee

Nominations and the charge for the Symposium Planning Committee were discussed. It was decided to first compose a committee of internal UF WI faculty and the Progress Energy representative. This group would be charged with developing a theme and format for the Symposium, and based on this identify other external members for the Committee. The larger committee would then be charged with identifying speakers, panel members etc. for the Symposium. The Committee will only be responsible for brainstorming and inviting speakers. Water Institute staff , together with the UF Office for Conferences, will handle all logistical details.

Nominees for the internal UF Committee Members included: Joe Delfino, Ramesh Reddy, Les Theil, Tom Ankerson, Bron Taylor and Ruth Francis Floyd.

## Discuss procedures for formalizing relationship between WI and existing Centers

The need for formalizing the relationship between the WI and existing Centers was discussed. The current list of affiliated centers is long, and not all Centers are equally interested and invested. Some may not even know they are listed. It was agreed that we would create a Center database similar to the Faculty Expertise Database. Each Center would be invited to affiliate by populating the database which would contain 1) Center Name, 2) Center Director and Contact Info, 3) Center Mission, and 4) Brief paragraph Summarizing their programmatic interest in water-related issues.
